SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Pope Francis has established a special Sunday to celebrate God's Word, inviting us to see the Bible not as a distant text, but as a living conversation with God. Many Catholics feel intimidated by scripture, but through our weekly Mass readings we actually know more than we realise!

But we can go deeper still. *Lectio Divina* offers a simple way to pray with with the Word of God. Read a passage slowly, reflect on words that touch your heart, respond in prayer, and then quietly listen to God. It's a way of making space to hear God speaking directly to you. Take this week's missalette home. Spend ten quiet minutes reading, reflecting, and listening. God is always speaking - we just need to learn to hear Him.

MONEYGLASS NOVENA TO OUR LADY

The parish of Duneane is organising a novena to Our Lady of Lourdes which will take place at the national shrine at Moneyglass. The novena begins on **Monday 3rd February** at runs at 7pm each evening until **Tuesday 11th February**. Mass and novena prayers will be celebrated each evening and there will be a number of guest speakers and preachers. The shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes is one of our diocesan jubilee pilgrimage locations for the Holy Year.

HOW TO PRAY WITH THE BIBLE

Lectio Divina consists of four simple steps that anyone can learn. You only need to take a couple of minutes for each step. Begin by taking a short bible passage (like today's Gospel).

- **1. Lectio** (*Reading*): Slowly read the scripture passage (perhaps two or three times), paying attention to the words that seem to catch your attention.
- **2**. **Meditatio** (*Meditation*): Reflect deeply on the text. What is God saying to you specifically through these words? Don't worry about understanding everything perfectly just be present and attentive.
- **3. Oratio** (*Prayer*): Respond to God's word. Share your heart with him. What feelings, desires, or struggles arise as you hear his message? Tell him how you feel.
- **4**. **Contemplatio** (*Contemplation*): Rest in God's presence. Sometimes prayer is less about speaking and more about listening, about being still and knowing that he is God.
