UNDERSTANDING THE EUCHARIST

During August this year the Gospel readings at Sunday Mass come from John Chapter 6 where Jesus explains the sacrament of the Eucharist. This is a chance for us to reflect on the great gift we receive in Holy



Communion - the body of Christ himself.

It's also an opportunity to consider how we receive Holy Communion. This week we reflect on the **Communion Fast**.

The Church requires Catholics to **fast for an hour** before Holy Communion. This fast is a sign of respect to the Blessed Sacrament and an act of preparing our hearts for the greatest food of all. It also reminds us of those who are hungry in the world and encourages us to help in whatever way we can.

Receiving Communion while fasting is an ancient tradition and in the past people fasted from midnight. In recent years the fast is only required to last sixty minutes before Communion itself. During that time we should abstain from food and drink (except water and medication).

Those who are old or sick are exempt from the fast as are those who receive Communion at home or in hospital. Priests who celebrate more than one Mass in a day need only keep the fast before their first Mass.
