DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING FOR PEACE

Pope Francis has called for a day of prayer and fasting for peace in the Middle East on Monday (7th) which is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. We have Mass at 10am on Monday and it will be offered for this intention.

The rosary will be prayed publicly in the church before Mass in the morning and again at 6pm. Please join us if you can or pray the rosary at home for peace.

There will also be Mass on Monday at 10am in St Malachy's, Coleraine and at 10.30am in Portrush. The rosary will be prayed in public in the churches Portrush, Portstewart and Coleraine on the hour between 9am and 7pm.

If your health and circumstances permit, you may wish to fast on Monday or go off something for the day for this special intention.

CANDLELIGHT ROSARY

During October the rosary will be prayed in the church on Wednesday evenings at 7pm by candlelight. This week we pray the Luminous Mysteries.



SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Arrangements are being finalised for the celebration of First Confession, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation next year. Children attending St Brigid's Primary School and Ballymoney Model Integrated Primary School are already enrolled for these sacraments and will undertake their preparation in school.

For children attending other schools who wish to receive their sacraments in 2025, participation in a sacramental preparation course is required. This course will be held at St Malachy's Parish Centre in Coleraine, beginning in October 2024.

An enrolment meeting for parents and guardians of children taking part in the sacramental preparation courses will take place in St Malachy's Parish Centre on Wednesday, 9th October at 7pm.

The following children are eligible for the sacraments: First Confession & First Communion - children in P4 (or older) Confirmation - Children in P7 (or older).
