HOLY YEAR 2025

On Christmas Eve Pope Francis will open the Holy Door in St Peter's in Rome to begin the Jubilee Holy Year of 2025. A jubilee is traditionally celebrated by the Church every twenty five years. It is a year set aside for us to repent of our sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on our spiritual life.

In the Diocese the celebration of the Holy Year will begin the following Sunday on the Feast of the Holy Family. All parishioners are warmly invited to join Bishop Alan McGuckian at the Solemn Opening Mass on Sunday 29th December at 3pm in St Peter's Cathedral, Belfast. In Ballymoney we will mark the beginning of the Holy Year and our own Parish Bicentenary year with Mass and Benediction at 10am on New Year's Day.
